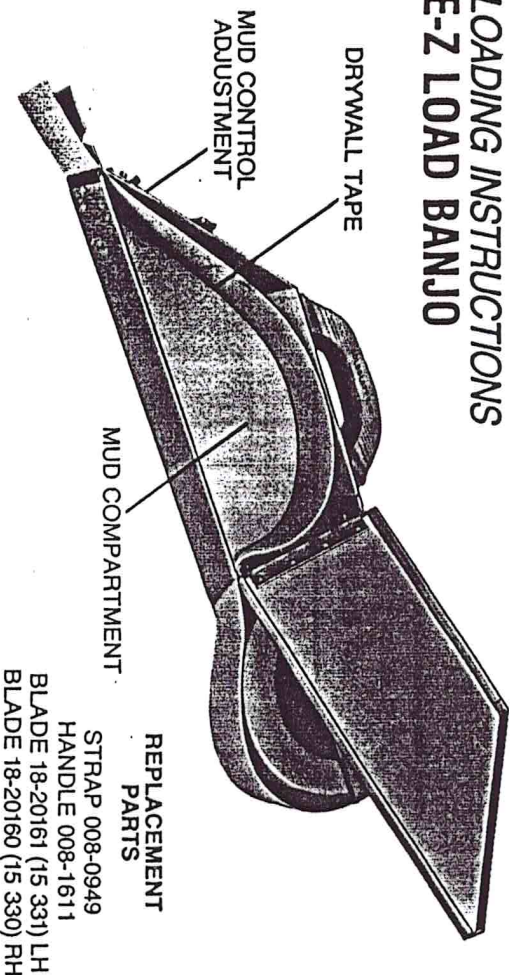


LOADING INSTRUCTIONS E-Z LOAD BANJO



1. Lay Banjo on its side with mud compartment door facing up.
2. Back off $\frac{1}{4}$ turn fastener on tape spindle and raise tape spool collar.
3. Insert 250 or 500-foot (up to $2\frac{1}{8}$ " wide) roll of tape that unreels in clockwise direction.
4. Thread 8" to 12" of tape into back slot of mud compartment.
5. Replace collar over tape roll and tighten $\frac{1}{4}$ turn fastener.
6. Unlatch mud compartment and open lid all the way.
7. Thread tape through front slot of mud compartment and extend tape about 6" past edge of cutoff blade.
8. Adjust cutoff blade to almost "CLOSED" position. Blade will be adjusted later after mud is loaded.
9. Move tape from the bottom to the top and along both sides of the mud compartment; tape will ride on "TOP" of the mud.
10. Preparing and loading mud:
 - A. Mix mud to "thick-gravy" pourable consistency.
 - B. Pour mud into the body of the Banjo.
 - C. Pull a few inches of tape out of the nozzle and check the amount of mud on the tape. If more mud is desired, loosen wing nut on the cutoff blade and adjust opening accordingly.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS E-Z LOAD BANJO

1. With flip of the wrist, "dunk" (point nozzle toward floor) Banjo quickly to allow mud to flow into nozzle of the machine.
2. Pull out about 6" of tape.
3. Position tape at the beginning of joint and hold with 6" or 8" taping knife.
4. Pull out a comfortable length of tape keeping Banjo about 6" from the joint. Quickly dunk Banjo again.
5. Adhere tape to wall/ceiling to cover joint. Move taping knife to new starting point and repeat pull/dunk operation until you reach the end of the joint.
6. At the end of the joint, hold tape firm by depressing it through "U" (notch) opening on the cutting blade. Then, quickly twist the machine so that the cutter blade shears the tape.
7. With taping knife, flatten tape (bedding it to the wall/ceiling), remove excess mud into a mud pan for re-use.

REMEMBER: KEEP BANJO CLEAN AT ALL TIMES... DO NOT ALLOW MUD TO STAY IN MACHINE FOR MORE THAN A TWO HOUR PERIOD.
